TRIAL ENTRY INFORMATION

Trial Entry Open and Closing

- The draw period for the trial will open on Friday, June 12, 2020 at 12:00 PM noon Eastern Time. Entries will be awarded by random draw of all entries received between 12:00 PM noon Eastern Time on Friday, June 12, 2020 and 12:00 PM noon Eastern Time on Sunday, June 14, 2020.
- Trial entry will close at the end of the draw if the trial and wait list are deemed full. If the trial and wait list are not full, the trial will remain open for entries until they are deemed full or on the closing date which is 12:00 PM noon Eastern Time on Thursday, June 25, 2020.
- We will not be taking payment until you are given a space in the trial. If you are given a space in the trial, you will receive information on how to submit payment. You will then have **3 days** to complete your payment via Stripe, PayPal or postmark your mail to confirm your space in the trial.

Entry Method

All entries will be on-line via the link provided to the NACSW™ trial entry form. Paper and phone entries will not be accepted. Completing the form is not a guarantee of entry. You will receive an auto-response email confirming that we received your trial entry after registration - this email does not confirm your space in the trial. There will be a separate confirmation from WonderWoman@redhuskies.com to let you know if your entry has been given a space in the trial.

Entry Requirements & Selection

A Qualified Entry is one that meets all the following criteria:

1. Complete the online trial entry entry during the draw period listed above.
2. The Handler is a NACSW™ member for the 2019-2020 membership year (8/1/19- 7/31/20).
3. The Dog is registered with the NACSW™
4. Dogs participating in a trial must be at least one year of age.
5. The Dog has passed the appropriate ORT and prior title level at least 14 days before the trial opens for entries.
6. Qualified entry for Summit League – Dog dog has earned an ELT-CH or ELT3 title at least 14 days before the trial opens for entries. Any dog that has trialed twice in Summit League Trials during the calendar year will be considered to be an FEO entry for additional Summit League Trials.

Trial spaces will be determined in the following manner:

- Spaces will be awarded by a random draw of all Qualified Entries received during the draw period listed above. For Summit trials teams that meet the ELT-CH title requirement will be placed above teams that meet the ELT3 requirement in the draw.
- In the event that you are having technical difficulties with the entry system, please email trialentry@nacsw.net prior to the end of the draw period.
- No dog will be given a space in more than one trial of the same level at a single event.
- You may enter multiple dogs for entry in the draw. However, only one dog/handler per title level will be accepted into the trial. Entry will go to the dog selected in the draw – you may not swap to an alternate dog. If multiple dogs are selected in the draw, you may select which dog you wish to enter. Once a dog has been entered as a second dog/handler entry, you may not swap handlers after the draw to change the entry to a first dog/handler unless the trial is not full.
- If a trial level is not full after the draw of Qualified Entries, then there will be a Secondary Draw of any entries received that did not meet the ORT or title requirements. These entries will be accepted pending completion of the requirements. Note: dogs must earn the appropriate ORT and prior title level at least 3 days prior to the trial date to be eligible to compete. If the required title or ORT is earned less than 14 days prior to the event, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the host that the requirement has been completed.
- After all entries received during the draw period are processed, if the trial level is still not full, entries will continue to be accepted in the order they are received through the closing date or when entries fill.
- For Exhibit Only Dogs (FEO): Dogs running FEO are not eligible to receive titles or earn placement ribbons. FEO results will not be included in the posted trial results.
 - If space remains after all qualified entries are accommodated on Thursday, June 25, 2020, then we will offer spaces for those who wish to run a dog For Exhibition Only (FEO). Second dog/handler FEO entries on the same day will be offered spaces after Thursday, July 2, 2020.
- The trial host of an event has the right to refuse entry of any competitor or dog for just cause as approved by the National Trial Committee. Just cause includes lack of

adherence to NACSW™ rules and guidelines and the policies outlined in each event entry premium.

- Some trial entries may be given priority entry based on contributions to the organization and the trial process.

You will be notified via email of the results of the random draw by end of day on Friday, June 19, 2020. You will then have 3 days to complete your payment via Stripe, PayPal or postmark your mail to confirm your space in the trial. Stripe information will be sent in the confirmation email. Payable via Paypal or credit card through the Paypal site - no Paypal account required. Please check "Sending money to friend" to eliminate fees for both parties. A waiting list for alternates will be started as soon as entries fill. Alternates will be contacted when a space opens. Depending on last minute trial logistics, we may opt to not fill all canceled spaces.

NACSW™ reserves the right to cancel a trial if minimum entry numbers are not met.

Be sure you read and understand the guidelines for this trial before entering. By submitting a registration for this NACSW™ Trial, you acknowledge that you have read, understand, and accept the policies and liability information of NACSW™.

CANCELLATION POLICY

The following cancellation policy applies:

- For cancellation of entries before 5:00 PM Eastern Time on June 25, 2020: full refund minus \$25 processing fee will be issued if host can fill your space.
- No refunds will be issued for cancellations after 5:00 PM Eastern Time on June 25, 2020 or if host cannot fill your space. Please note: Due to time constraints, host may opt to not fill cancelled spaces and no refund will be issued.
- No refunds will be issued for cancellations during the last 72 hours before the event or for no-shows.

All cancellations must be emailed to WonderWoman@redhuskies.com. Refunds will be processed after the trial commences or as time permits before.

Entry fees shall not be refunded if a dog or handler is absent, disqualified, or excused by the NACSW™ official or judge.

This cancellation and refund policy applies to competitors that must withdraw for any reason including but not limited to injury, illness, emergency, and personal or work-related reasons.

No part of the fee will be refunded if the trial cannot take place or be completed by reason of fire, civil disturbances, an Act of God, public emergency, or any other cause beyond the control of the trial organizers.

LOCATION DETAILS

Modeled after real-life detection work, NACSW trials are held in many different locations, with a variety of terrain, under varying weather conditions. Dogs and handlers need to be able to safely negotiate a variety of surfaces, including, but not limited to, tile, linoleum, carpeting, gravel, asphalt, uneven surfaces, and slippery footing. Handlers should be prepared to deal with a variety of weather conditions, including heat, cold, rain and snow. Trials frequently require covering extensive distances to get to and from the parking area to each of the search areas and generally require that this be done across natural, uneven surfaces. Handlers should be prepared for the physical demands and must be able to navigate the terrain with their dog accordingly.

Participants should expect to spend most of the day outside or in their vehicles as there are rarely indoor crating options at trials. Please be prepared for you and your canine partner to deal with all of these varying environmental challenges. Handlers should familiarize themselves with potential regional risks and health concerns that may affect themselves or their dogs. Handlers agree that they are entering this trial at their own risk.

Site Specific Conditions

This trial location is on a university campus. The university is divided into two main parts of the campus: the academic side and the athletic side, separated by U.S. Route 15. Friday will likely be held on the athletic side of the campus, and Saturday will be held on the academic side of the campus. There is parking on both sides of the campus but also an underpass for walking between the two sides safely. Summer school will be in session during this trial and students, student athletes, faculty, and staff will be present on Friday and some may be around on Saturday. While we will do our best to prevent it, any of the aforementioned people may incidentally enter a search area. Caution should be used when walking dogs around the campus as there will be light vehicle traffic. Dog potty areas will be most grassy areas around the buildings and parking lots. There is no shade in the competitor parking lot, but there may be an indoor crating option on the academic side of the campus if the facility is not being used by the university and if the location is not being used as a possible search area. Please see the section on indoor crating below. There are indoor restrooms and accessible restrooms located throughout both sides of the campus for our use. There are restrooms on ground level on both sides of the campus, but depending on the flow to/from search areas and line of sight, you may be redirected

to use an alternate restroom on another floor or other side of the building. Pathways to/from the restrooms and many search areas are paved, stone, or sidewalk. Some pathways to/from search areas, as well as within some search areas, may require you to navigate grass, gravel, stone/brick pathways, or dirt. The terrain is mild and moderate. There may be stairways or steps entering or within the search areas. Interior floors may be of any material and may be carpet or slippery. Due to the size of the campus, participants may be asked to drive to some search areas. Due to unforeseen conditions, such as weather or change in availability of areas at the location, the expected search areas, parking, and pathways to the search areas may be modified at the last minute. Please contact the host for additional information and do not call the trial site directly.

Reactive Dog Parking

There will be reactive dog parking at this trial for those who wish to park in this area. There will be a reactive dog potty area, however this may be a smaller area or longer walk. There will not be separate warm up boxes.

Unentered Dogs

Unentered dogs must remain in the competitor's vehicle during the trial day. There will be ample potty areas, but unentered dogs should not be allowed to "play," exercise, or train on the trial grounds.

RV Parking

This trial location has limited RV parking during the day for competitors and volunteers. There is also limited RV parking overnight. RVs must be fully self-contained (the facility does not provide water, electricity, gas or sewage dump). Overnight parking is located on the athletic side of the campus only. To reserve a space you will need to contact the host after you receive a confirmation that you have received a space in the event. Please email WonderWoman@redhuskies.com to reserve RV space. You will need to register your vehicle with Public Safety (located on the academic side of the campus). Additionally, there are other sites, campgrounds, and RV parks that allow overnight RV parking with some offering possible water, electricity, sewage, etc. It is the competitor/volunteer's responsibility to reserve a space with the host or make other (overnight) arrangements for their RV outside of trial hours.

Indoor Crating

Participant parking on the academic side of the campus is located near Memorial Gym. You may have the option of crating in/around your vehicle in the parking lot or inside Memorial Gym. This option may not be finalized until the day of the trial as there are many factors surrounding its use. For instance, if there is a sports game outside that needs to be relocated inside due to weather, the gym will become unavailable for our use. If we can use the gym for indoor crating, the

following information applies. The crating area inside Memorial Gym is located on the first floor/ground level on the gym/basketball court. We have the entire gym floor to crate and set up tailgate chairs. Chairs and crates are NOT provided. Restrooms are located inside Memorial Gym for both participants crating inside Memorial Gym and participants hanging out in the parking lot. Memorial Gym is NOT air conditioned, but does provide shade for the summer months and there are several large floor fans to help with airflow. Competitors may also bring fans. Battery operated fans are preferred as outlets may be hard to find or have limited access. There are strict rules for crating. There must be both a padded layer and a waterproof layer under the entire length/width of the crate. The padding may be a blanket and the waterproof layer may be a tarp. The padding must be enough to make sure the crate does not damage, dent, nick or otherwise leave a mark on the gym floor. Soft sided crates or tents are preferred. The waterproof layer must be enough to prevent water damage to the wood gym flooring. If either or both are missing or are inadequate, you will not be able to crate inside. Please bring a towel to clean up your area after crating inside or in the event of rainy/muddy weather, to clean up after wet/muddy feet and paws. Due to unforeseen conditions, such as weather or change in the availability of areas at the location, this policy may be modified at the last minute. Please make primary arrangements to crate in your car in the event the gym becomes unavailable during our event.

Running Vehicles or Generators in the Parking Lot

There is ample parking at this location and running your vehicles or generators in the parking lot is allowed at this trial. We ask that you show consideration for fellow competitors parked near you, remain away from staging areas, warm up boxes and parking lot numbers. There may be a separate parking area for those needing to run generators due to exhaust and noise. There is likely to be an indoor hospitality area for competitors. There are indoor restrooms located near competitor parking and throughout the campus for competitor and volunteer use. You may wish to run your vehicle to keep warm or cool depending on the weather.

Smoking

Smoking is not allowed on this trial site, including the use of e-cigarettes.

Hotels and Directions

Most hotels/motels are located within 20-25 minutes from the trial site (near Columbia, MD). Please allow extra travel time for navigating highways and traveling through neighboring residential areas and school zones. A list of area hotels and directions will be provided with entry confirmations as well as posted on RedHuskies.com

DOG INFORMATION

Dog Policies:

- All dogs must be on a 6' leash at all times when not being tested. NO flexi-leashes while not participating in a competition search.
- Reactive and/or spatially challenged dogs should wear a red bandana (to be provided by the dog's handler) to help signal others that the dog needs extra space from other dogs.
- Dogs will be toileted in designated areas and handlers must pick-up and dispose of waste.
- Dogs and handlers must stay in designated areas to avoid contaminating testing space, interrupting a test, or from viewing any part of the testing.
- Competitors should expect to keep their dogs confined in a crate or vehicle when not competing. The logistics of a trial typically do not allow for dogs to hang out on leash in between searches. Competitors should plan to provide their own shade using canopies or shade cloths.

Females in Season:

Will be allowed to run wearing "pants" at the very end of the running orders after all other dogs have been judged. Females in season will be parked and pottied in areas separate from the other dogs while at the trial if the location logistics permit. Handlers must contact WonderWoman@redhuskies.com so plans can be made for the dog.

OTHER INFORMATION

Rules:

Complete rules are available at www.NACSW.net. **It is the responsibility of each competitor to read and understand the current NACSW™ Rule book prior to participating in a NACSW™ event.**

Liability:

By registering for the trial, the competitor hereby assumes all risks of, and responsibility for, accidents and/or damage to her/himself or to her/his property or to others, resulting from the actions of her/his dog. The competitor expressly agree that the NACSW™, Red Huskies and its assignees or any other person, or persons, of said groups, shall not be held liable personally, or collectively, under any circumstances, for injury, and/or damage to her/himself, for loss or injury to property, whether due to uncontrolled dogs or negligence of any member of said groups, or any other cause, or causes. The competitor also agrees to assume all financial liability that may be incurred by the NACSW™ due to the actions of themselves or their dogs regardless of the cause.

Sportsmanship:

All competitors/handlers and spectators are expected to follow the rules of the NACSW™ and demonstrate good sportsmanship. This includes making sure the hide placements are unknown to the handler prior to testing and kept secret from other competitors. Please do not discuss hide

placement or any details of a dog's performance that may provide information or clues to other handlers or may be overheard.

Summit League Titles

The SMT Title is earned by placing in the top 20% overall of competing teams at a Summit League Trial.

In the event of a tie for the last titling placement, both teams would receive a title. For example, if there are 25 competing teams and there was a tie for 5th place, both teams would receive a SMT title for a total of 6 titles given at that trial.

NACSW™ Results:

Results for each search and overall will be posted after all searches are completed and scores are verified for you to record your results for your own records. It is your responsibility to ensure your scores are accurate prior to leaving trial grounds. In the event that a discrepancy cannot be verified at the trial, you may be instructed to submit a score card review request. It is not the responsibility of the host or NACSW to return score sheets that are left behind or to mail ribbons that are not picked up.

Spectators:

All spectators must check in and sign a waiver. Spectating will be allowed at elements, space permitting and at the Certifying Official's discretion. Spectators may not photograph or video searches. Children under 18 must always be directly supervised by a parent/guardian. No dogs will be allowed in the spectator area. No unentered dogs with spectators are allowed at the trial. Spectators are reminded that the hide placements must not be discussed nor should they speak with any competitors about what they saw until after the trial is complete. Competitors are not allowed to watch the trial at any time.

Videotaping and Photography

At this time, competitors may be allowed to take videos and photos of the search areas during the competitor walk through in order to help familiarize themselves with the search area. Due to site privacy issues or time constraints, competitors may not be allowed to photograph or video a search area during the walk through. At the host's discretion, a photographer and/or video service may be present during the trial to offer photos and/or videos for sale to the competitors.

As a condition of your entry, you agree to allow NACSW™, or their agents, to video you and your dog during the entirety of the NACSW™ event. These videos are the property of NACSW™. All competitors, through entry at any NACSW™ event, waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast or photography of such event.
